Dr. Lee's lucid and scholarly Introduction to Roman Law was received with much praise when it first appeared in 1944. It is gratifying to see that its success was such as to require a reprint after only two years. The book must be recommended to all students of Roman Law.

Dishttein on the latest legislation respecting bigamous marriage. The new rules are the result of harmonious collaboration of the Administration and the Rabbinate, in a field which, owing to the complicated state of Jewish law concerning polygamy, bristles with difficulties.
